Excellent Egyptians

18th April Trip to Science museum

9th May -Egyptian day - dress up as an ancient Egyptian or an archaeologist and enjoy Egyptian activities all day! More information to follow.

Maths: Decimals, Money and Time.

Round decimals with 1 decimal place to the nearest whole number, compare numbers with the same number of decimal places up to 2 decimal places, solve simple measure and money problems involving fractions and decimals to 2 decimal place.

Estimate, compare and calculate different measures, including money in pounds and pence

Read, write and convert time between analogue and digital 12- and 24-hour clocks. Solve problems involving converting from hours to minutes, minutes to seconds, years to months, weeks to days.

History: Ancient Egyptians

Using a chronological timeline, children will look at the structure of Egyptian society and compare it with civilisations from the past and the future. Paying particular attention to the geographical features of Egypt and looking at how evidence has survived.

Geography: Coasts

Using map skills to undertake a comparative study of coastal regions to consider feature formation, changes over time and safety considerations

Science: States of Matter

Children will continue to explore states of matter, focusing on changes of state given materials with different properties and different conditions. Children will devise and set up practical enquiries and undertake comparative and fair tests.

DT: Cushion Making

The children will use their History learning to design a cushion. Using their knowledge of colour, pattern and fabric from the Egyptian period in this process. They will use a range of tools in putting together their cushion including various stitches.

French - Jacques et les haricots magiques - Jack and the beanstalk. We will be using a dual text story book to make our own story of Jack and the beanstalk in French.
